Welcome to this month's Bulletin.

Perhaps one of the busiest times of the bonsai year. You should have re-potted most things by now and be sitting back watching everything come to life. It's still an anxious time, trees you gave winter protection to should now be finding their way out onto the open benches, but being very prepared to bring them back under cover if we experience any last minute frosts or inclement weather. Where my garden is located, we seem to have had one of the wettest winters on record, rain most days. Still it's all part of this fascinating hobby getting the best out of your trees whatever Mother Nature throws at us.

This month I need to thank two people for their hard work behind the scenes.

Firstly, a big thank you to Amelia Williams who has been putting together a series of very helpful handbooks. These handbooks are aimed at complementing the existing knowledge available and moving the UK bonsai community forward in a positive direction. They cover five specific specialist areas within the hobby, exhibiting, judging, running shows, running clubs and societies, and developing vour bonsai. Whether vou're a novice or an old hand at the hobby, whether one particular subject interests you or you browse all five handbooks, they make interesting reading. These handbooks will be available to everyone in the future free of charge, with a launch date of the 14Apr24 at the Expo Bonsai UK. Secondly, I would like to thank Liz Panton for endeavouring to complete the thankless task of updating the UKBA Club and Society listings. This list is used by many people and it's good to know the list is accurate and up to date. She has asked me in turn to thank everyone who corresponded with her and confirmed their respective club details.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind everybody, especially event organisers that we update the UKBA events diary on an

almost daily basis. This obviously is good news for the average bonsai enthusiast visiting an upand-coming show. But what is not so obvious, is the usefulness of the events diary stretching into the future. This enables organisers to schedule their respective events on days when there are no other clashing events. We hope that event organisers will notify us immediately by email of any future event, even if we mark the event as provisional and at a later date move the status of the event too confirmed, it helps other organisers to choose a date that does not clash with another. Unfortunately, this last month on the 24Mar24 we saw an example of things going wrong. We have possibly five car boot style events taking place in the UK this year and two of them were on the 24Mar24. These events were located almost 4 hours drive apart, but still reports afterwards on social media reported lower attendances than usual at both. If they were on separate dates, even just one week apart, sellers and buyers would then get the opportunity to visit both events. We would kindly advise event organisers to

always consult the diary before committing to a future date and plant your event flag in the sand as early as possible.

Jeremy Wheeler

On Thursday 22nd February 2024, we tragically lost a dear friend and Dragon Bonsai Team colleague.

Jerry was an incredible person, who shared everything he knew with us all, he never once had too little time to teach anyone who asked for advice or help.

His enthusiasm and skills were known nationally throughout the Bonsai community both in the United Kingdom and further afield in Europe where he commanded both the respect and friendship of so many.

He would always tell you where you needed to look – and what to do to with any tree, especially if it was a Juniper or Yew – although there wasn't any tree that he couldn't offer his wisdom and knowledge on.

He was a brilliant teacher – and was never afraid to tell you where you were going wrong – and how to best progress your tree. He'd always ask the group to offer their views on his own trees that he'd brought in and through some lengthy discussions we were all learning. We were so fortunate to spend time with Jerry. He would often spend the entire Sunday at a club meeting – working on other member's trees – and anything he'd brought in himself to work on was carried back into his car at the end of the day.

Hearing him saying "That branch has to go ... " and , " If it was my tree . . " were legendary

in our club, and we often handed over the branch cutters if we just couldn't do it. He was a lovely, gentle, and beautiful soul that we will remember forever.

It is with great sadness that Manchester Bonsai Society has to report the passing of Roy Booth on January 2024.

Roy was a stalwart of MBS for many years, regularly winning the Ted Fuller Cup at the annual show and supporting our displays at RHS Tatton. He was a founder member of MBS and served as both secretary and chairman. Roy was always generous with his advice and help for less experienced members and forthright in supplying others with down to earth opinions when they were getting too la-de-da. In recognition, Roy was awarded honorary life membership.

In later years he was unable to attend meetings for health reasons and didn't want to bother anyone by asking for lifts to and from. However, during COVID he joined in our Zoom meetings, bringing his usual pithy humour to both the videos and discussion. He kept informed of our goings-on via the monthly Newsletters.

Monthly Tasks

Below is a list of bonsai tasks to be carried out during the month of April, it must be adapted to your localised conditions and is meant only as a general advisory list of tasks for the bonsai enthusiast.

Bonsai in April

Spring has now sprung and hopefully all your bonsai trees have come through the winter. Here is a quick generic guide to bonsai in April but for individual species check out some of the other species-specific posts.

. Watering:

In the UK it has been a fairly dry winter so continue to check your trees daily and water as required but start to increase your watering with the buds now pushing and leaves opening. Water in the mornings ideally to avoid the colder temperatures at night. Spray any repotted trees to ensure they do not dry out.

Re-potting:

You should now be coming to an end of your repotting so keep an eye on the trees which you have repotted.

Review any trees that have yet to be repotted as it is a slow start to spring for some species so you could still repot in early April if it stays cool.

For any trees that you are not repotting still remove the top surface and re-top dress to remove any crusting on the surface to improve airflow and drainage down through the soil. Plus clean the pots of the trees if they have got green algae forming on them.

Feeding:

For broadleaved trees, start feeding any trees that are now out in leaf that you did not repot while do not

feed those repotted in March yet, wait till the end of April. Start increasing the feeding of evergreen trees as they start to show more signs of stronger growth.

Tropical trees and Evergreens can continue to be fed with a low nitrogen feed to maintain health and vigour at the onset of spring. Feed flowering trees that have not been repotted yet like Forsythia, Chamomiles, Cherry, Akebia etc.

Pruning:

Species to avoid pruning in Spring due to potential for sap bleeding would be Acer, Betula, Carpinus, Carya, Juglans, Magnolia, Morus, Populus and Tilia.

Remove unwanted branches and look for dead branches now that you can see the new buds swelling and clean out any dead branches before the leaves fully flush. Prune back any branches that are too long to a suitable live bud pointing in the right direction. Seal any large wounds with cut paste.

Trimming:

Now that the leaves are starting to appear trimming can be carried out to remove the terminal shoot in some species to aid with creating a more compact form. Continue to prune tropical trees to maintain their shape and trim the new shoots.

Where too much growth is expected and buds are well advanced, removal of unwanted future twigs may be anticipated by pinching out buds now. Where density is required of foliage, pinch or remove the terminal bud to promote side buds to develop. This is also a good opportunity to check buds to see if they are viable.

Root pruning:

Species to avoid severe root pruning in Spring due to potential for sap bleeding would be Acer, Betula, Carpinus, Carya, Juglans, Magnolia, Morus, Populus and Tilia. It is still worth checking the roots of trees that you are not fully repotting but this is more difficult if you have wired the trees into your pots as advised. If you are not seeing good bud swelling, then potentially there is an issue with the roots so remove from the pot and check for white root tips and healthy roots.

Insects and pests: Check for the newly emerging bugs and pests like green and black fly, red spider mite, scale insect, mealy bug as well as vine weevil beetles. With the onset of warmer weather insect pests can start to emerge and are more likely to appear on the new shoots and leaves. Moss and weed control:

Continue to keep this in check and treat or remove unwanted moss and remove any newly forming weeds.

Wiring:

Check wires and guys to ensure they are not cutting in and this is a good time to straighten out dis-used wire, which can be re-used for training wire.

Protection:

Continue to protect from late frosts as it is still not very warm outside and ensure to harden off leaves before moving your trees out from a cold greenhouse.

Assessment:

Continue to update your bonsai records and photograph your trees to record their progress.

Tools:

The following is something everyone should do each time they use their tools but often it is not easy to do depending on how often you use them. However, it is good practice to clean and sharpen your tools after use and this is also a good time to go through your tool kits and clean them up before the start of the pruning season.

Display areas:

Subject to how you display your trees, if you are looking to bring your trees out later in

Spring from their winter protection it is an ideal time to clean off your display areas or benches and disinfect them as well as re-treat with a wood preservative or relevant treatment for the material so they show your trees off once they are ready to come out.

If you have flowering trees, think about setting up a viewing of display area so you can admire these while they are in bloom and if you do bring them indoor ensure they remain in a cool room and only for a couple of days.

Propagation:

Take cuttings of late starters. Pot on last year's seedlings.

Interview UKBA Interview With Tom Buchanan



How did you get started?

I'd been interested in Bonsai for a while but never had a garden (or the patience) to do anything about it. Around 2000 I moved into a flat that had some outside space, and picked up a few starter trees - the usual suspects - and started pulling seedlings out of flowerbeds and so on. Most of them died fairly rapidly, but I do still have some of my 'first trees'.

How did you learn about bonsai?

Mainly from the Internet and books. This was back before Facebook and Instagram, but there were a few specialised bonsai forums such as the "Internet Bonsai Club" and "Gardenweb" where I picked up a lot of information. More recently I'm very fortunate in that my club, Sutton Bonsai Society, has a number of members who practice bonsai at a very high level. I've learned a lot from them.



Who was your teacher?

I've never really had a teacher - in fact I've never even done a workshop! I've tried to see as many talks and demonstrations as I can though, and followed the work of various people online. Probably the people who've influenced me most in terms of approach are Will Baddeley and Peter Warren.



Do you belong to a bonsai club?

I've been a member of Sutton Bonsai Society since 2015. Previously to that I had worked on bonsai alone, and not had a 'club' other than

people I talked to online and one or two friends who also grew bonsai. Nowadays I'd always recommend people to join a club - for me it opened up a lot of opportunities in terms of showing trees, collecting opportunities, and the chance to talk to other bonsai hobbyists.

Do you consider bonsai an art form?

I think bonsai has both art and horticultural craft elements. Once you start thinking about design, presentation, and display, then I think you're definitely in the realm of an artistic pursuit. I'm really interested in formal bonsai display.



Do you have a favourite tree species or size of tree?

I find that most of the trees I like are chuhin sized. I have all sizes in my collection (other than super-large ones - nothing bigger than a one-person lift). I'm trying to build my shohin collection, but I usually find the trees that I really like are just a bit bigger than that. In terms of species, I am mainly drawn to UK natives, particularly deciduous species such as elms and hawthorns. Having said that, I do have quite a few Scots pines that I've collected over the years.



Do you have a favourite bonsai?

Most of my favourite trees are owned by other people! I don't think I have a favourite tree in my collection, but there are a few that I particularly like - mostly trees I have been working on for a long time and have a bit of history with. All of my trees are self-developed, either from semi-styled stock, trees that I have collected, or garden centre material. That means most of the better ones have been in my garden for a long time.



Do you have a favourite potter?

I don't have a favourite potter. There are a fair number of UK potters that I like and I wouldn't want to single any out. Potters whom I've commissioned work from include Dan Barton, Stone Monkey, Daniel Butler, Tony Oswin, Gordon Duffett, Erin, Tony Remington, Christine Beresford, Walsall Ceramics, Springwood Ceramics - so that may say something about my tastes. I also like good quality Japanese pots.



What mistakes have you made?

Too many to list, most of them resulting from either poor choices or overworking trees. Last summer I almost lost a very promising shohin maple in the late heatwave - I use a watering system in the summer, but this one wasn't getting any water because I'd put it back in the wrong place on the bench. It took me two days to notice the leaves had gone crispy. Fortunately it has surprised, but it was a bit tense waiting to see if it would bud out again.



Have you experienced bonsai abroad?

I haven't been to Japan or any of the big European shows so far. I do try to visit public collections when I can - for instance in the Barcelona botanic garden, and more recently the Lake Merritt bonsai collection in San Francisco. Both worth a visit with some nice trees.

Can you recommend one or two books? My favourite book is Four Seasons of Bonsai by Kyuzo Murata which is great for inspiration, rather than 'how to' instructions.

What is your best achievement? Very recently, I've had the first ever flowers on a small Prunus spinosa that I've been developing for over 20 years. That felt like a real achievement



Over the years what has been your favourite bonsai show?

In terms of regular shows, rather than one-offs, I've always liked Expo Bonsai UK (https://expobonsaiuk.weebly.com) which everyone will be familiar with. My favourite though is probably the two-day show that Sutton Bonsai Society holds every year in the superb setting of RHS Wisley. That gives a fairly relaxed opportunity for bonsai display, with lots of visitors from the general public, and typically includes a good number of high-quality trees.



Do you have any other interests or hobbies? Related to bonsai, I am keen on growing accent plants and kusamono. I also make carved wooden stands - although nowadays that's only when I need one for a specific display, as they are so much work. Outside of bonsai I'm keen on watersports, especially paddleboarding.
